### **STUDENT’S RIGHT TO CANCEL**

Should the student be terminated or cancel for any reason, all refunds will be made per the following refund policy and schedule:

**Cancellation within Cancellation Period:** The student has right to cancel the enrollment agreement and obtain a refund of enrollment agreement and obtain a refund of charges paid through attendance at the first day of class session, or seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later.

1. Student can cancel the enrollment agreement or drop the program in person or by certified mail any time throughout the program.
2. Refunds will be made within 30 days of termination or receipt of Cancellation Notice.
3. The cancellation will be effective from the date

**Cancellation after the Cancellation Period:** Cancellation after the cancellation period, will be considered as withdrawal. The student will be eligible for pro-rata refund according the hours attended and with the exception of the non-refund of registration fee and background fee.

1. Student can cancel the enrollment agreement or drop the program in person or by certified mail any time throughout the program.



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2. The students are entitled to a refund when they have completed 60% or less of period of attendance and are entitled to a pro rata refund.
3. The  termination date for refund computation purposes is the last date of actual attendance by the student unless earlier written notice is received.
4. Refunds will be made within 30 days of termination or receipt of Cancellation Notice.
5. A student can be dismissed, at the discretion of the Chief Execution Officer, for insufficient progress, nonpayment of costs, or failure to comply with rules.
6. If the school terminates a program for any reason, the student will receive a 100% refund on monies paid to the school.

For a student who is on a leave of absence, the termination date is the last date of attendance before the student left on the leave of absence.
